MEMORANDUM FOR MR. G.M. CAMPBELL

This is a brief memorandum on the general subject of my demonstration to be given in your office on Monday, March 16th. This demonstration is the first ever given to any non-government unit; and it is the first ever given to anybody on this machine, (with the exception of my abortive visit to the Navy Department four years ago).

I will show that the printed document entitled "Chaocipher - the Ultimate Elusion" is a concrete example of the product of my machine and methods for the achievement of panlateral distribution. I state that my system produces a cipher which is indecipherable by any process of human ratiocination. My system is available for every person, in every language forever. In fact, my system furnishes the complete solution of the cipher problem.

By my system the essential character of language - which for want of a better name we may call its soul - is utterly disrupted and transmuted.

And this fact will have a direct bearing on our whole teleological concept. Note, in this connection, the famous "Argument from Design."

Transmission and reception of the matter of the document "Chaocipher - the Ultimate Elusion" as it stands would require 100% accuracy. But I want it understood that my system can produce indecipherable cipher which would not require 100% accuracy either in transmission or reception.

I will discuss the subject of transmission errors, which would be of relatively little importance, and also of coping with errors in reception, which is more vital. I will also discuss the use of elaborate machines with multiple constituents.

I am not au fait with the purely technical and electrical details of transmission by radio, but, in this connection, I shall refer to the possible limitation of characters to 5 or even 3.
